 decedent except mortgages on Real Estate the
 expenses of his last sickness and funeral and
 costs of this proceeding. And that the Clerk of this
 Court give to his said Widow Christina Hines
 a certificate to that effect. It is therefore
 ordered that no letter of Administration
 shall issue on said Estate and the whole is
 to be left off the docket. All of which is found
 & adjudged & determined by the Court.
