To the Honorable Judge of the Court
of Common Pleas of Adams County and State of Indiana,

The undersigned administrator of the Estate of
Thomas S Lewis, deceased, would represent to the Court of Common
pleas of said County that the personal Estate of said deceased
amounts to one hundred and twenty one dollars and fifty five
Cents, all of which personal Estate was claimed by the widow
of said deceased and received by her as shown by the inventory
now on file in the Clerk's office of said Court with her vouchers
there for and that there now remains in the hands of your
petitioner as the administrator of said Estate, no assets in his
hands whatever to pay debts due against said Estate, and
from the best information your petitioner can obtain the
debts against said Estate will amount to the sum
of fifty dollars.

Your petitioner would further represent to the
Court that said decedent died the owner in fee simple of
the North West quarter of the North West quarter of Section twenty
seven (27), Township twenty seven (27) North of Range fourteen (14),
East containing forty (40) acres, which has been appraised at
two hundred and forty (\$400) and that the decedent left
as his heirs, his widow Susannah Lewis and three children,
Samuel Lewis aged seven years, James Lewis aged five years
Caroline Lewis aged three years, all of said County of Adams,
and who are all the heirs of the decedent known to your
petitioner and that said widow is entitled to the undivided
one third part of said land free from all demands of creditors.

He therefore asks for an order to ^{sell} the undivided two
thirds of the land aforesaid for the payment of debts against
said Estate.
