Dear Sir,

I send you a copy of Mr Logue's will, also the deed for record. Mr Logue died in December about the 20th 1856, in this City, leaving Frances Logue his widow, and Augusta Logue of full age, and Edward, Mary, William, Julia, Elizabeth James and Austin Logue all of whom are minors his heirs at law. Their ages I presume are not necessary if it be alleged that they are minors it will be sufficient.

The assets that came in the hands of the administrators here amount to about the sum of \$3000.00. The debts as nearly as can be ascertained amount to the sum of \$18000.00. I cannot get the Probate Judges Certificate to this reason, no account has yet been filed in his office, and debts are still coming in against the estate. The admrs here are anxious that you should at once proceed and dispose of the lands giving them notice before sale.

That Patrick Melling during his life time, and after his death the children of my sister Hannah shall inherit the eighty acre tract in Paris Ohio on which they now reside, subject to such legal claims as I may have against said Melling, it being my intention always not to claim any profit growing out of the purchase of said land.

The second condition is, that if my said wife should not remain my widow, in that event I wish one equal half of all my property to be applied equally to the use and benefit of my children.

I hereby appoint my beloved wife Frances to be my sole executrix of this my last will and Testament.
