 for which there has been no rent yet Received the said  
 interest in said land is worth about \$150.00  
 It is not yet ascertained that there will be any personal  
 property left of the said Estate of Cornelius Baker for said  
 Minor. I have paid George Baker for said  
 the Court of Common Pleas of pr R do l. \$5.00  
 State of Indiana Adams County & ss of George Meyer  
 Guardian of George Baker a Minor being duly  
 sworn says that the above inventory is according  
 to the best of his knowledge & belief a just and  
 true inventory of all the property of said Minor which  
 has been received by him as said Guardian and now  
 remaining in his hands or invested by him and the

 to the best of his knowledge & belief a full & true account  
 of all his receipts & disbursements on account of said Minor
