Which said Report after having been carefully examined by the Court is found to be correct. and the Court having examined the vouchers filed with said Report finds that all the moneys and effects which came to the hands of said Guardian in this behalf have been fully accounted for. It is therefore ordered and adjudged and determined by the Court, that said settlement be regarded as a final settlement of said Guardianship and that said account be fully settled and allowed. The said Guardian now here presents and files in open Court his resignation of his said trust. in words and figures following to wit: Of Eli Beery Guardian of the persons and Estate of Elizabeth Blosser, Hannah Blosser, Daniel Blosser, Lewis Blosser, Pierce Blosser and Mary Ann Blosser, minor heirs of Albin Blosser deceased, do hereby resign my trust as such Guardian of said Minors and ask to be discharged from all further responsibility as such this 3<sup>d</sup> day of January 1859. Eli Beery.

And the Court after having fully examined the premises do order and adjudge and determine, that said Guardian be discharged from all further accountability to the Court, or liability on his bond, all of which is ordered and adjudged and determined by the Court.
