its true cash value, which appraisement is now here returned into court  
by said appraisers appraising the land described in said petition to-wit: The  
undivided two-thirds of the North East quarter of the South East quarter of sec-  
tion six and three acres of the North side of the South East quarter of the  
South East quarter of section six commencing at the North West corner  
of said lot, running thence west fifty rods, thence south ten rods, thence

87 Whereupon the court in consideration of the premises order adjudge and determine that said guardian proceed to sell the above described real estate at private sale, by giving three weeks notice of the time and place of said sale by publishing the same in some newspaper printed and published in the said county of Adams for three successive weeks, and at not less than its appraised value, And that the same be sold for one third cash in hand one third in one year and one third the remainder in two years from date of sale, deferred payments to bear interest one to be secured with freshhold security to be approved by said Guardian, And said Guardian is further ordered to report his proceedings in the premises, and on motion this cause is continued
