I, the undersigned, Jeremiah Andrews, residing in Washington Township, in Adams County, in the State of Indiana, being of sound mind and disposing memory, do hereby make and publish the following last will and testament, hereby revoking any and all other wills by me heretofore made, to wit:

Item First:

It is my will and I do hereby give, devise and bequeath all of my property, both real, personal and mixed, of any and every kind whatever, to my beloved wife Sarah Jane Andrews; all said property to be here in fee-simple absolutely, subject only to my just debts which she will pay; and I do hereby appoint her, my said wife, executrix of this my last will and testament.
