Will of Noah W. Anspaugh.

I, Noah W. Anspaugh of Adams County, Indiana, hereby make my last will and testament,

1st. I give and bequeath to my wife, Emma Anspaugh, all my property, real personal and mixed together with my life insurance, policy to have and to hold after the payment of all my just debts during her natural life.

2d. I hereby make it a condition of this will, that my wife shall as each of my children, viz. James S. Anspaugh, Edward S. Anspaugh, Nora E. Anspaugh, Elmer J. Anspaugh and George W. Anspaugh, shall become twenty one years old,

give and pay to the said child or children reaching said age, two hundred dollars out of personal property and rents and profits of my real estate conveyed in this will, but should my wife not be able at the time that any of my said children shall reach the said age of twenty one years to pay said sum of two hundred dollars the same shall not be payable, but it or any part of its remaining unpaid shall be and remain a lien

against the real estate herein conveyed, until the death of my wife, after which such child or children so unpaid shall receive their equal pro rata out of property herein conveyed or left by my wife at her death.

3d. I hereby appoint my wife executrix of this will. On testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 11<sup>th</sup> day of September 1900,

I, Elmer J. Anspaugh and George W. Anspaugh all of my estate enumerated in item first of this will, they to have the same in fee simple absolute in equal shares.4th I hereby appoint my wife executrix of this will.
