I Christian G. Augsburgen of Linn Grove Adams County State of Indiana and by Deception a Farmer make this my last Will I give devise and bequeath my Estate and property Real and Personal as follows

It is my Will that if I should die before my beloved wife Elisabeth Augsburgen then and in that Event all my debts Doctor Bills and Funeral Expenses shall be paid out of my estate

And the remainder of my estate both Real Estate and Personal Property I give to and bequeath to my beloved wife Elisabeth Augsburgen - So long as she shall live.

I appoint Elisabeth Augsburgen of Linn Grove Adams County Indiana and by occupation a Housewife My Executor who shall serve without giving bond of this my Will.

In witness whereof I have signed and sealed and published and declared this Instrument as my Will at Berne, Adams County Indiana on the Twenty Eighth day of April 1904
