I The Name of The Reverend Father of All

I Isaac Bartholmeus of Providence Township Lucas County and State of Ohio, do make and publish this my last will and testament

Item 1st. I give and devise to my beloved wife Lydia Bartholmeus one hundred and twenty acres of land to the same more or less in view of her favor for which said land I hold debt made to me by one John Weaver, which said land is situate in Washington Township Adams County and State of Indiana.

Item 2nd. I also give and devise to my beloved wife the Town Lot upon which we now live with all the buildings thereon with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging, said lot being number fifty seven (57) on the Town Plat of Providence Lucas County, Ohio

Item 3rd. I give and devise to my brother-in-law Thomas Welch of Lucas County Ohio all my right title and interest in and to the estate of my beloved and lamented brother Jacob Bartholmeus deceased, who died in Richland County Ohio.

Item 4th. I give and devise to my much esteemed friend James M. Coffey of Maumee City all the law books or works upon the science of law of which I may be possessed at the time of my decease.

Item 5th. I give and devise to my beloved wife all the household furniture, stock, provisions, rights, credits, moneys, goods, chattels and effects of which I may be possessed, with the exception of such items or articles as are hereinafter otherwise given or devised. She however selling so much as shall be necessary and sufficient to pay my just debts.

Item 6th. I do hereby nominate and appoint my beloved wife Lydia Bartholmeus, and Helen P. Atte, executors or executrix and executor of this my last will and testament hereby authorizing them and empowering them to compromise adjust

release and discharge in such manner as they may deem proper and lawful and I do also challenge and empower them full full power necessary to sell in order to paying my debts by private sale or otherwise and upon such terms of credit as they may think proper all or any part of my real estate and debts to purchase to execute, acknowledge and release in full.

I do revoke all former wills by me made.

This day was produced in open Court an instrument purporting to be the last will and testament of Isaac Parkheimer which was duly proved by the oaths of Thos. Beach and Hudson Canon whose examinations were reduced to writing; and it appearing to the satisfaction of all the Court that the said Isaac Parkheimer at the time of executing said will was of full age and of sound mind and memory and not under any restraint. It is therefore ordered that John P. Able and Lydia Parkheimer be appointed executor and executrix upon said estate and Samuel G. Rowland and Michael Thaler accepted as bail in the sum of Two Thousand Dollars and Levi Cottrell, Thomas W. Walker & Eubank N. Munson appraisers upon said estate.
