Will of Mary Baxter decd.

I, Mary Baxter being weak of body but of sound mind so make and publish this my last will and testament in this manner to wit that my husband George Baxter shall have all my property both real and personal at my death that this bequest be subject to the condition that my said husband shall at the marriage of each of my daughters furnish them each with a good bed and bedding and other household goods not to exceed in value in all the sum of one hundred dollars to each.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the ninth day of July A.D. 1872. Mary Baxter (Boole)

Signed, Sealed and acknowledged in the presence of David Stroabaker and John P. Quinn who witness the same in the presence of the testator at her request and in presence of each other this 9 July 1872. John P. Quinn

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Be it known that John P. Quinn one of the subscribing witnesses of the last Will and Testament of Mary Baxter late of Adams County, deceased, personally appeared before the undersigned Clerk of the Adams Circuit Court of Adams County being of lawful age and being by me duly sworn, deposed as follows: That Mary Baxter deceased on the day of 1872 that she left the foregoing as her last will and Testament; that the undersigned was present and saw the testator sign her name to the same and she also published and declared that the same was her last will and Testament. That she was of sound mind and memory, fully competent to devise her property, and was under no restraint or coercion what ever. That David Stroabaker and John P. Quinn each signed their names to the same as subscribing witnesses: in her presence and at her request and in the presence of each other John P. Quinn
