Will of William Beeler.

Know all men that I William Beeler of Adams County and State of Indiana, whole of sound mind, do make and publish this my last will and testament revoking all former wills by me made.

I leave $\frac{1}{4}$ I desire that all my just debts and my funeral expenses shall be fully paid. Item $\frac{2}{4}$ I desire that all my property of every description including money, shall after my death be equally divided between my law children viz: Selzer, Emos, Joseph, Daniel and Daniel Beeler and Mary E. Bryan, Wagner, J. Howard, Cara, L. Lewis, Arona & Loggins, Martha E. Sheriff and if any one of my said children shall refuse to accept under this will the share intended by this will for him or her shall be taken and divided equally between those who do accept the terms of this will.

I do also hereby make constitute and appoint as executors of this my last will and testament Emos Beeler and Daniel Beeler to act as such in all things without bond.
