Last Will of John B. Beasley

Be it remembered that on the 20th day of August 1886 the same being the 9th legal day of the April Term 1886 of the aforesaid Court in and before the Honorable James A. Robo Judge of said Court in following proceedings were had by said Court to wit:

On the matter of the last will of
John B. Beasley

came now Christian B. Beasley ^{an}, files his petition to have the last will of John B. Beasley deceased admitted to Probate and which petition is in these words (4-0)
And it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court from the sworn testimony of David Beasley one of the subscribing witnesses to the last will of said deceased that said will was duly executed by said testator and that said testator at the time of executing the same was competent to devise his property, was of sound mind ^{an} memory ^{an} under no seal, pain or coercion whatsoever.

It is therefore adjudged and ordered by the Court that said Will by ^{an}, the same is hereby admitted to Probate as the last will ^{an} testament of said John B. Beasley deceased and the same is now entered of record in these words

I, John B. Beasley of Union Township, Adams County, Indiana being of sound mind and memory but knowing the uncertainty of human life so made, declare ^{an}, publish this my last will ^{an} testament, hereby making ^{an}, making void all former wills by me made of any.

1st It is my will ^{an} testament that my body be decently interred corresponding to my condition in life, and my funeral expenses including the erection of suitable tomb stone to my grave to be borne by my estate.

2nd It is my will ^{an}, I bequeath unto my two sons Christian B. Beasley ^{an}, Frederick Beasley all my estate not hereby disposed of both real ^{an}, personal

3rd It is my will ^{an} I hereby appoint my son Christian Beasley ^{an}, Frederick Beasley Executor of this my

last will leaving it to them in severalty to the use
 letters of testamentary, of the said testator,

 is done now in presence of David Stuebner

 at my request in my presence and in presence
 of each other.
