The Last Will and Testament of Loham Bogly

of Berene, Indiana. I the said Loham Bogly, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, considering the uncertainty of Continuance in life, and desiring to make such disposition of my worldly estate as I deem best, do make, publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling any and all former wills or Wills in whole or in part made by me made.

First I desire all my just debts and funeral expenses to be paid as soon as possible after my decease.

Second I to my Will and seize that all my real, mixed and personal property shall be converted into cash as soon as practicable after my decease. Third I give and bequeath to the First Methodist Church of Berne, Adams County Indiana Fifty dollars. (50<sup>00</sup>)

Fourth, I give and bequeath to the Reformed Jesuit Congregation of Berne, Adams County Indiana, Fifty (50<sup>00</sup>) dollars.

Fifth, I give and bequeath to my brother Abraham residing in Switzerland Fifty (50<sup>00</sup>) dollars.

Sixth, I give and bequeath to my sister Rosina residing in Switzerland Fifteen (15<sup>00</sup>) dollars.

Seventh, I give and bequeath to my brother-in-law Gotfried Res, residing in Switzerland Fifty (50<sup>00</sup>) dollars.

Eighth This my Will and Testament that the residue of my estate be equally divided among my eight brothers and Sisters or their legal heirs. Share and share alike.

I appoint and nominate J. F. Lehman as Executor of this my last Will and Testament.

As witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Ninth day of September, in the year of Our Lord eighteen hundred and ninety Six.
