I Jacob Bame of Adams County, State of Indiana do hereby make and publish the following

Will and Testament:
I think I am and desire to my beloved wife Mary Elizabeth Bame in being of her
interest in my land, of farms which are now made, besides so far as she is concerned
quantity of the same as she may desire, that I give and bequeath unto her the same
to have and to possess unto her and her heirs forever, I do hereby give and bequeath
unto my daughter Mary Anne three hundred dollars (\$300) all in full of the sum of
money which I have in Adams County, Indiana, during the lifetime of the said
Mary Anne, and all the stock, household goods, furniture and other goods and chattels which
I may be deemed to have at the time of my decease, during the natural lifetime of the said
Mary Anne, and my said wife do not receive or possess said goods and desires to my
said daughter Mary Anne, and all the stock, household goods, furniture, and other
goods and chattels which may be deemed to be due and owing to my said daughter
Mary Anne.

I do hereby give and bequeath to my son Christian Bame in return
and to be paid by the following amounts to the trustees of my children
and their heirs. To my daughter Sophie Jager two hundred dollars (\$200)
payable one year after the death of my said wife without interest.
To my son David Christian Bame and his heirs two hundred dollars (\$200)
payable two years after the death of my said wife without interest.
To my daughter Mary Anne three hundred dollars (\$300) payable three
years after the death of my said wife without interest.
To my daughter Louisa Miller three hundred dollars (\$300) payable four
years after the death of my said wife without interest.
To my daughter Susannah Bame five hundred dollars (\$500) to be
paid five years after the death of my said wife without interest.
I do hereby nominate and appoint my wife, Mary
Elizabeth Bame, executrix of this my last will and testament, hereby
authorizing and empowering her to compromise, adjust, release and
discharge in such manner as she may deem proper the
debts and claims due and owing.

I do hereby revoke all former wills by me made.
In Testimony hereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 11th
day of January, 1896.
