First: This my will that all my just debts and funeral expenses be first paid.  
Second: This is my will and I hereby bequest to my beloved wife Margaret Basse all my estate both real and personal of whatever description or kind whatsoever for her use, during her natural life, and at her death then the same shall be divided as follows, one thousand dollars in each shall be paid to Elizabeth Basse, wife of my son Frank Basse, do have and let number 121 in Section 2nd shall go to Catharine Basse my daughter, do have and let no 116 in Section 2nd shall go to my daughter Mary Basse, do have and let no 117 in Section 2nd shall go to my son William Basse, providing however that he shall pay \$200.00 being hundred dollars to his sister Mary Basse and whatever may be left after do above bequests do same shall be divided equally among my four children. Namely, Catharine Basse, Frank Basse, William Basse and Mary Basse share and share alike except do household goods which shall go to Mary Basse my daughter and William Basse my son, and do at of good sense to go to my son Frank Basse.

I do hereby constitute and appoint my son William Basse as to executor of this my last will and Testament without Bond.
