Last Will and Testament of Alexander Brandyberry.

I, Alexander Brandyberry Son of the Village of Monroe Adams County State of Indiana being of sound mind and memory do make, publish and declare this to be my last will and Testament to wit:

First: All my just debts and funeral expenses shall be first fully paid.

Second: I give devise and bequeath all the real estate and remainder of my estate both real and personal to my beloved wife Sarah Jane Brandyberry to have to hold to her my said wife so long as she may live and she to control the farming of said farm here and she to control the farming of said farm and at and after the death of my said wife (Sarah Jane Brandyberry) said real estate shall fall to my legal heirs only.

Third: I nominate and appoint Abraham Brandyberry to be my executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills made by me and seal this 23rd day of August 1875
