I, Jacob Braunnemann of Berne, Adams County in the State of Indiana being of sound mind and disposing memory, do hereby make, publish and declare this to be my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills made by me.

Item 1. It is my will that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid.

Item 2. After the payment of my debts and funeral expenses as in item "1" of this will provided, then it is my will and I hereby give, devise and bequeath to my wife Anna Braunnemann, to have and to hold so long as she live, all the rest and residue of my estate, real personal and mixed her, natural lifetime, and I hereby give her full power to sell, convey and dispose of any of said estate, execute deeds therefor, in to change the investment thereof, and to shall not be liable to account to any one for any action she may take in the management, control or use of said estate during such time.

Item 3. It is further my will, that after the death of my wife Anna Braunnemann, then I give, devise and bequeath the rest and residue of my estate, real personal and mixed, remaining after the use thereof by my said wife as in item "2" of this will provided, to Ernest Kneubuhler, son of my wife Anna Braunnemann and to Jacob Braunnemann my son of my first wife, and to Edward H. Braunnemann my son of my present wife in the following portions, to-wit; To Ernest Kneubuhler the one fifth (1/5); to Jacob Braunnemann the two fifth (2/5) and to Edward H. Braunnemann the two fifth (2/5); It being further my will and intention by this will, for good and sufficient reasons, to disinherit Anna Braunnemann, Frederick Braunnemann and Rudolph Braunnemann, children of my first marriage, they to take nothing.

In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal and have published and declared this instrument as my last will and testament, this 23 d day of February, 1909.
