I, John Brown Sen. of Adams County Indiana being of sound mind, do make and publish this my last will.

I give and bequeath all my property both real and personal, to my wife Margaret to have and hold during her life time, provided that she keep said Real Estate free from incumbrances and waste; Provided however if she should at any time desire to sell said real estate she may do so taking One Third (1/3) of the proceeds thereof for her share, and the remaining Two Thirds (2/3) to be equally divided among my four Children, to wit: - George Mary, Peter John P. and Maggie. My son John Brown Jr. having already received his share, and provided further that if my said wife Margaret should deem the One Third (1/3) above mentioned, not sufficient to maintain her during her life time - she may set off to herself a greater portion than the One Third (1/3) and the remainder to be divided as above provided.

I hereby name and appoint my eldest son George Brown, to be and act as my Executor of this my last will and he shall assist my wife in the management and division of my estate.

The witness whereof I have signed and sealed and declared this instrument as my will at Decatur, Adams County Indiana, this 11th day of May 1899.
