 I, Daniel Brewster, of Adams County, Indiana, being of sound mind and memory, do make, publish and declare to be my Last Will and Testament in manner following, to wit: I will and direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid in full from money on hand at my death, if any, and from the sale of the personal property not bequeathed by this will and from Real Estate ordered sold by this will.
 I give, devise and bequeath to Loversa Brewster, my beloved wife, the North West quarter of the North West quarter of Section Twenty one, Township North West quarter of Section Twenty one, Range Twenty five, Range Fifteen east, Containing forty seven and one half, to be held during her natural life term or as long as she remains my widow, in full condition that she has all her right, title and interest in the South West quarter of the North West quarter of Section Twenty one, Township Twenty five, Range Twenty five, Range Fifteen east, to all my here named below or to their heirs, executors, administrators, assigns and assigns forever, same to be disposed of and proceeds used as stated further on in this instrument, and upon the subsequent marriage or death of Loversa Brewster, my wife, the said forty seven and one half shall be divided equally among all my children.
