 In the name of the benevolent Father of all, I Charles Brock of Adams County, West Virginia, being of sound mind, do make and publish the my last Will and Testament.  
 I give and devise to my beloved wife Mary C. Brock the household furniture on which we now reside, situate in Adams County, West Virginia, containing about eight by six acres, twenty acres lying in section 6 & 7 and part of section 5 being her maternal life, and all the stock, household goods and all money on hand at my death, furniture, provisions and farming implements and hay and grain, and other goods and chattels that we let there on at my death, during her natural life, as aforesaid, she being to make thereof as she may be disposed to pay my just debts.  
 If at the death of my said wife the real estate aforesaid, I give and devise to my two daughter Mary M. Bailey and Elizabeth J. Brock to be equally divided between them, also all the chattels and provisions and machinery that we let there on at her death.  
 In testimony hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 26<sup>th</sup> day of December 1896.
