I John Brude of the County of Adams in the State of Indiana do make publish and declare the following as my last will and testament, to wit;

I direct that after my death my body shall be decently and respectfully buried, and the expenses thereof together with the expenses of my sickness and all just by me owing shall be paid as soon after my death as it may be practicable for my Executor to pay the same giving the lawful preference in pay to such claims as preference is given to by the law, and all my property either real personal or mixed that may be left after the payments aforesaid I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Anna Barbara if she should out live me to be hers to use as she may please to use it until she should get married, In case she should get married again or in the event of her death, then, and in either case the property which may be left as aforesaid after the payments of all just debts and expenses shall go to my daughter Anna Isabella, and in the event of the death of my wife and daughter or in the event of the want of issue of my wife and

death of my daughter then and in
this case the said property shall
go to my brother Daniel and sister
Natalie and Anna Barbara Hunt and
share alike.

The bequest herein made to my wife
is intended to be in lieu of her dower
in my Estate and property if she
shall see fit to accept of it as such.
My property consists of the house
and lot where I now live in the
town of Decatur. Household furniture
tools stock and money about three hun-

dred dollars which is now in Gorman
and for which a power of Attorney has
been sent out, and to enable my
Executor to make the payments aforesaid
he is to take possession of my property
aforesaid and have it appraised and
sell of it as is proper to sell to make
satisfaction of public debt according to
law. But nothing herein shall be so
construed as to prevent my wife from
keeping such property as she may
see fit to keep for her own use, if
the same may not be needed in
the payment of debts.

I hereby appoint and constitute
friend John S. Tyler as the Executor
of this my last will and testament,
the testimony whereof I John Bond
the Testator named in the foregoing

will have hereunto set my hand and
affixed my seal this 28th day of August
1850
