 I Jacob Buhler of Berrett, Indiana being of sound mind
 and knowing the uncertainties of this life do make and
 publish this my last will and testament. "I Item First -"
 I give devise and bequest to my beloved wife Rose Ann
 Buhler all of my personal property, jewelry and all description
 whatsoever to have and to hold absolutely in her own right
 "I Item Second" I give devise and bequest to my said wife
 Rose Ann Buhler, all my real estate located in Berrett
 town. Commencing at the South east corner of our lot
 to 155 in the town of Berrett, Adams County Indiana,
 thence running North 178 feet, thence west 126 feet, thence South
 178 feet, thence east to the place of beginning 126 feet, being the east
 part of our lots No 155 & 156 in said town of Berrett, to have
 and to hold in fee simple, absolutely in her own right
 "I Item Third": It is my will and I direct that my said
 wife shall settle up my estate, after my death
 pay off and discharge all my just debts, as well
 all claims that may be due me, and I hereby
 specially authorize and empower her to sell, any
 or all of my real estate or personal property and
 convey the same by good and sufficient deed of conveyance,
 on such terms and at such price as she may deem
 right without any order of Court as to do, I being my
 express intention and will that after the payment of
 my debts and funeral expenses that all my property
 both real and personal shall belong to my said wife
 absolutely, subject only to my said debts. "I Item Fourth:"
 I hereby nominate and appoint my said wife Rose
 Ann Buhler, Executrix of thomy last will and testament
 and specially will and request that she be not
 required to give, or give bond as such Executrix
 and it is my desire and I direct that my son
 John Buhler shall assist my said Executrix
 in settling my Estate.
