In the name of the Protestant Episcopate of all
 the undersigned, John Burr, residing in Providence
 and and disposing of my mind, being of sound
 understanding of life to last, make, ~~at~~ publish and
 declare the following to be my last will and
 testament, hereby resolving and by my last will and
 by me hereby at mass.

Item First
 It is my will that all my just debts and funeral
 expenses shall be paid as soon as can be done
 without sacrifice to my estate.

Item Second
 After the payment of my debts and funeral
 expenses as in item first of this will provided,
 then it is my will and I hereby give devise and
 bequeath all the rest and residue of my estate,
 real, personal and mixed to my beloved wife
 Ann Burr, to have and to hold during her
 natural life; she to have the right to use any
 portion thereof to maintain herself and my
 children and she shall not be liable to account
 management, control or use of said estate
 during such time.

Item Third.
 It is further my will that after the death
 of my wife, I hereby give devise and bequeath
 to my son William Burr, the sum of Five
 hundred (\$500.) Dollars the same to be his
 absolute and in fee simple.

Item Fourth.
 It is further my will, after the payment
 of all debts and funeral expenses and of the
 payment of the special bequest as mentioned
 in Item Third hereof then it is my will and
 I hereby give, devise and bequeath all the
 rest and residue of my estate so remaining
 after the use thereof by my said wife,
 as mentioned in second Item of this will, to my

children, namely: Elizabeth, Emma, Caroline and William, Dece and slave state
 Geo. Buford.

It is my will that if my wife shall live until my son William shall be of age, my wife shall pay him for the work and management of farm the customary way, it or at time.
