I, Dora Byerly, nee Nancy Dora Thurmon, residing Herk

sound mind & disposing memory, yet realizing the un-
certainties of life, do hereby make, publish and declare the un-
following to be my last will & testament, hereby revoking
any & all wills by me heretofore made, to-wit:

Item 1st.
It is my will that all my just debts, funeral expenses, ex-
penses of last sickness & all other liabilities of my estate be
paid out of my estate as soon after my decease as the same
can be reasonably done without sacrifice to my estate &
that my personal estate be first used for that purpose!

Item 2nd.
Subject to the provisions of item first hereof, I hereby give,
will, bequeath & devise to my beloved husband, Daniel M.
Byerly, all the real & residue of my estate, real estate, per-
sonal or mixed property, or estate or property of any kind or
description whatsoever and wherever situated, of which I may
die the owner, the same to be his absolutely & in fee simple.
