 conveniently done with out sacrifice to any of my property.

second I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Martha Ellen
 Case all my personal real and mixed property.

third I give and bequeath to my said wife Martha Ellen
 Case all my real estate for her use during her natural life
 and she wha. have the right to use the same as she
 may see fit for her use.

fourth I will and bequeath to my beloved son Lewis
 Case the some of one thousand dollars be for any thing
 should go to any other of my children. I then give and bequeath
 to my daughter Mattie Hamrick and Ruth Jack on their children
 each one \$1000 dollar also Nettie Spangler to receive one \$1000
 dollar to be paid at my death, and what ever is left of
 my said estate I give to my wife Martha Ellen Case during
 her life after her death the property that is left real personal
 or mixed I give and bequeath to my children Lewis Case,
 Maggie, Corwood, Belle Ainsworth, Frank Case, Earl Case,
 Lulu Ruff and Robert Case to share and share alike.

fifth if Lewis Case mentioned in this will should
 die intestate then the part willed to him shall go to Robert
 Case if he is living at the death of the said Lewis Case
 sixth and it is my further will that all Concerned will
 abide by this will just as I have made it.
