Last Will of Nancy Clear.

No. 468.

I, Nancy Clear, of Adams County in the State of Indiana, being of sound mind memory, and understanding, and knowing the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life do hereby make public and declare this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking and making void all wills by me at any time heretofore made, that is to say,

First, It is my will and I hereby direct that all my just debts including my funeral expenses and expense of my last sickness be paid as soon after my death as the same reasonably can.

Second: It is my will and I hereby direct that after my death my body be decently buried in a manner suitable to my condition in life and that a tomb stone be erected at my grave of the kind that I have heretofore caused to be placed to the grave of my former husband.

Third: All my personal property that I may own at the time of my death, I give and bequeath to my three children Mary J. Clark, Martha Let. Lee and William Hoagland, and my daughter-in-law, Amelia Hoagland, after paying expenses named in the first and second items of this will, cash to share and share alike.

Fourth: All the real estate that I shall own at the time of my death including the real estate situate in the County of Adams in the State of Indiana and described to-wit: The south east quarter of the south east quarter of section twenty five in township twenty eight north of range fourteen east, containing forty acres forty acres more or less also commencing fourteen rods west of the north east corner of the north west quarter of the north east quarter of section thirty six in said Township and range, thence south eighty rods, thence west sixteen rods, thence south eighty rods, thence east sixteen rods to the place of beginning, containing eight acres.
