Book 11th Testament of Maranda Foster

No 413

I Maranda Foster of Adams County State of Indiana, while of sound mind do hereby ^{make} publish this my last will and testament:

Item first: I give and devise to my daughter Mary Kauter five hundred and fifty dollars.

Item second: I give and devise to the legal heirs of George Foster deceased, Nelson four hundred and fifty dollars ^{and} the remainder Foster to have fifty dollars to be divided equal between said heirs in Adams County, John Plummer and Kallie Foster.

Item third: I give and devise to the legal heirs of my daughter Alice Parr, five hundred and fifty dollars. John Parr son of Alice Parr shall have three hundred and fifty dollars and Augusta Parr two hundred dollars.

Item fourth: I give and devise to my daughter Margaret Parr five hundred and fifty dollars.

Item fifth: I give and devise to my daughter Sarah Dix Bennett, five hundred and fifty dollars.

Item sixth: I give and devise to my son James Foster five hundred and fifty dollars.

Item seventh: I give and devise to my son Harry Foster five hundred and fifty dollars.

Item eighth: I give and devise to my grand son David Foster one fifty dollars.

Item nine: The residue of my estate shall be equally divided between my legal heirs after all my just debts ^{and} funeral expenses are paid.
