No. 741. I Adolphus Liebert of Adams County State of Indiana do hereby make and publish this my Last Will and Testament.

First. I hereby Will and bequeath to my Wife Johanna Liebert, the following real estate in the State of Indiana, in Salin County about eighty acres, Section thirty four (34) Township fourteen (14) Range two (2) West of first principal Meridian in said county, together with any and all other real estate of which I may die Seized if any.

Second. I Will and bequeath to my said Wife Johanna Liebert all the personal property of every description of which I may die Seized together with all money in hand or on deposit, all checks, notes, book accounts and all money demands, drafts, every description and choses in action.

Third. I hereby appoint my said Wife Johanna Liebert executrix of this my last Will and Testament to act as such without bond.
