Last Will and Testament of James Maloney

In the name of the Omnipotent Father of all  
 I, James Maloney, his next last will and  
 testament hereby appointing all former wills  
 by me made  
 I give and I give with my debts and funeral  
 expenses all part and interest of my former  
 the 50 acres upon which I had estate in Ross  
 Township Adams County Indiana divided in  
 the middle east and west, in the south half  
 I give to my beloved son William P. Maloney  
 I give to my beloved daughter Ruth Fisher wife  
 of James Fisher the use of the north half of  
 50 acres to have and to hold during his natural  
 life at his death to be sold on the proceeds to  
 be equally divided between his children or  
 the heirs at law of said children that may be  
 deceased

Item 2. It is my wish that the 7 or  
 acres owned by me situated in Ross Township  
 Adams County Indiana be divided into two  
 tracts that my beloved children William  
 P. Maloney and Ruth Fisher make the said division  
 one of said parts to contain 4 acres and  
 the other 3 acres and I give the said 4  
 acres to my beloved son William P. Maloney  
 and I give the use of the other 3 acres to my beloved  
 daughter Ruth Fisher during her natural life  
 at her death to be sold on the proceeds to  
 be equally divided between her children and the heirs  
 at law of her children as may be deceased

Item 3. It is my wish that my personal prop-  
 erty be equally divided between my said  
 children William P. Maloney and Ruth Fisher  
 cash and share alike and I hereby appoint my  
 beloved son William P. Maloney to be executor  
 of this my last will and testament without his  
 giving and security bond or bail.
