No. 712. Last Will of Testament of Jacob P. Moser, of Adams Co Indiana,
I Jacob P. Moser, being of sound mind and memory and not knowing when this my Earthly Life will end. do therefore desire to make this my Last will and Testament

Item 1. It is my will and desire that my beloved Wife Elizabeth Moser (after my Death) shall have out of my Estate One Thousand Dollars, said amount to be intrusted to my son Elias Moser, and he shall give of said amount to my beloved wife from time to time as he may see that she stands in need of the same and at her death if any remanes it shall be equally divided among my children.

Item 2. Item 3. And the Ballance of my estate Both Real and Personal shall be Equally divided among my children namely David J. Moser, Elias Moser, John J. Moser, Aberham Moser, Mary Moser, Aaron Moser, Noah Moser, Joseph Moser, Emma Moser, except my son John J. Moser, his Part of said estate shall be kept in Trust by my sons Elias Moser, and Aaron Moser, to be given to him at any time they may desire, and if said John J. Moser should die, then said estate to be given to his children.

Item And if any of my children attempt to Break this will then said child shall loose his or her part of said estate and shall not receive any part of it but their share shall be equally divided among the Ballance of my children.
