Last Will of Mary Ann Rio

As I will an Testament of Mary Ann Rio.

I Mary Ann Rio do hereby make an publick this my last will and testament hereby making all other wills at any time heretofore by me made void & of no effect;

Item first: It is my will that all my just debts & funeral expenses shall be paid out of my estate

Item second: It is my will that there be a tombstone erected at my grave not to exceed, thirty dollars

Item third: I give an bequeath to my beloved husband Frank Rio the following described land to wit Commencing at the south west corner of Du Lot, number three hundred and thirty nine (339) in the south west portion to the town of Decatur (now City of Decatur) thence to run north along the west line of said lot one hundred and twenty four (24) ft., thence east ¹¹⁰ feet, thence south One hundred and twenty four (24) feet, thence west ten Rods to the place of beginning together with all the household goods that I may have at my death for and during his natural life and after his death to belong to my children or their heirs share and share alike. my said husband however to keep the buildings on the above described property in repair and keep the taxes paid thereon

Item fourth: It is my will that there shall be thirty dollars set for me after my death which shall be paid out of my estate.

Item fifth: It is my will that all the residue of my estate shall be sold as soon as my executors herein after named. Kimpell the sum at a fair price and all the above bequests and expenses and just debts be paid then the residue to be divided as follows: To my said husband Frank Rio to pay the one third, and the two thirds to be equally divided amongst all my children or their legal heirs.

Item sixth: I hereby appoint my beloved husband Frank Rio a Executor of his my last will.
