Now all Men by these presents that I George W. Rockwood of Adams County State of Indiana while in good health and of sound mind do make and publish this my last will and testament Item 1st

I desire that after my death all my just debts shall be settled and fully paid Item 2nd I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Rhoda Rockwood the west half of the east half of the Southeast quarter of Section twenty nine in Township twenty five north range fifteen east in Adams County State of Indiana containing forty acres of land with all buildings thereon including all my household goods of every description whatever.

Item 3rd I give and bequeath to my Son Adam Rockwood - five dollars.

Item 4th. I give and bequeath to my daughter Madona Triplett twenty five dollars.

Item 5th I desire that after my death all the rest of my property both real and personal not herein bequeathed - shall be sold and after all my just debts including funeral expenses and the expenses of the sale of my said property the remainder or balance shall be equally divided between my daughters Anulab Winkler - Amy Fuse - Sarah Ober - Madona Triplett - Sina Blackmore and Viola Winkler - Also that this my last will and testament shall within three days after my death and burial be opened and read in the presence and hearing of all my heirs if they can be present at my late residence.

Item 6th hereby constitute and appoint Isaac Waley as the Executor of this my last will and testament - with Bond
