Last Will & Testament of Louisa Wittors

No 219

In the name of the Omnipotent God of all  
 I Louisa Wittors do make and publish  
 this my last will and testament hereby re-  
 voking all former wills hereby bequeath  
 First: To my well loved husband  
 to my husband's bed and during his  
 widowhood he to have the use and income  
 of the same for and during his natural life  
 with the exception of one bed, which bed I will  
 and bequeath to my son John consisting of one  
 straw tick feather tick, two pillows, a  
 bed, one sheet, one bolster, one coverlet  
 also one dining table, one chair to my son John  
 which property I bequeath to my son John  
 as I do the bed and bedding at the death of  
 my husband I bequeath the remainder of  
 my estate of every kind to my said son John  
 subject to the payment of my debts. In witness  
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal  
 this fourteenth day of <sup>January</sup> 1889  
 signed sealed delivered in my presence and in the presence of the testator as his request and  
 in his presence and in the presence of each
