MRS. MARY SCHINDLER YODER, daughter of Christian and Barbara Liechty Schindler, was born in Monroe Twp., near Berne, Ind., on November 28, 1862, and went to be with her Lord October 29, 1948 at the age of 85 years, 11 months and 1 day.

In her youth she accepted Christ as her Savior uniting with the Berne Defenseless Mennonite Church of which she remained a member until death.

On Dec. 17, 1891, she was united in marriage to John Yoder of this community. Together they shared life's joys and sorrows for almost (cut off)...mourn her departure...children and three great-grandchildren. Also one brother, Reuben, of Monroe Twp.; 2 sisters, Mrs. Noah F. (Sarah Ann) Moser of Monroe Twp. and Mrs. C. C. (Rachel) Moser of Battle Creek, Michigan and a host of relatives and

friends. Preceding her in death were her husband in Sept. 1940; a daughter, Lillian, who as a young woman was killed in an accident in 1924, and a son Homer, who died in infancy; her parents; two grandchildren; 1 brother Jacob of Berne; and two sisters, Mrs. Sam (Fannie) Egly of Geneva and Mrs. David (Lydia) Mettler of Berne.
