## MAX MEYER HEADED OVERSEAS WHEN WORD CAME OF CHILD'S DEATH

Pvt. Max Meyer, father of Judy Ann Meyer who was electrocuted at the home of her grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Edward Meyer, late Thursday afternoon, was aboard ship, headed overseas when he received the message of the fatal mishap to his small daughter. Meyer had boarded the ship at Boston on Wednesday and was aboard the vessel Friday morning when the message reached him. The ship was anchored about a mile and a half off the coast and was getting ready to leave on its ocean voyage.

Meyer made part of the trip home by plane and arrived here Saturday afternoon. He was given a two-weeks leave.

## FALB FUNERAL IS HELD TODAY

### David Falb, 85, of Linn Grove Dies At Hospital

Funeral services were held at 1:30 p.m. today at the Yager Funeral Home for David Falb, 85, a lifelong resident of the Linn Grove community. Rev. Roscoe Coleman, pastor of the Wesleyan Methodist church, Bluffton, officiated and burial was in Greenwood cemetery.

Falb, a blacksmith in Linn Grove for many years, died at 1:45 p.m. Wednesday at the Adams County Memorial hospital where he had been a patient since March 3. On that day he and his wife were both admitted to the hospital. She died that night. Falb received a fractured hip in a fall in the hospital a few days ago and his condition had been serious since.

He was born at Linn Grove Jan. 10, 1869, the son of Isaac and Anna Reinhardt Falb. His wife was the former Marie Mertz. A sister, Mrs. Ralph Knoff, Pittsburgh, Pa. (cut off)
