THERE MAY BE A DEPRESSION, BUT CERTAINLY NOT IN THE "WEDDING INDUSTRY"

Dan Cupid is still active in Berne and community. There may be a depression in many other lines and industries, but certainly not in the wedding business in this part of the state. While many towns and cities much larger than Berne complain that Dan Cupid's business has fallen off, it is just the opposite here. Depression seems to improve Cupid's business in Berne and community, 23 couples having been married in the immediate vicinity of Berne in 1934, up to June 3. This is an increase of five weddings over the same period last year. If we made any mistake or omitted a wedding solemnized in the near vicinity of Berne, or in town, this year, kindly notify us.

Employees of the Berne Review have been very instrumental in swelling the list of weddings this year, four from this shop having ventured into the sea of matrimony.
