Local People at Wedding of Well Known School Teacher

The wedding of Miss Lois Fuhrman, daughter of Mrs. Drucilla Fuhrman of Decatur, and Rev. Martin Kenney Cobble of Andersonville, Tenn., son of D. H. Cobble, took place at the Mt. Pleasant Methodist Episcopal church Saturday noon.

Rev. L. L. C. Wisner of Orland officiated at the ceremony and the single ring service was used.

The church was beautifully decorated for the occasion with autumn leaves, palms and cut flowers. Miss Dorothy Sprunger of Wolcottville played the Lohengrin wedding march.

The bride was attended by Miss Gertrude Cobble of Greenville, Tenn., and Norval Fuhrman attended the groom. The ushers were Russel Flory and Victor Kline of Logansport.

Lucille Sprunger, niece of the bride, acted as ring bearer. She wore a frock of blue organdie and carried the ring in a white lily.

The bride's gown was of white moss crepe, fashioned floor length. A small white hat of the same material, and white footwear completed her costume. She carried a corsage of American beauty roses.

The bridesmaid's gown was of rose crepe, also fashioned floor length. White accessories were worn with the gown and she carried an arm bouquet of Talisman roses.

Following the wedding a dinner was served at the bride's home for forty-five guests. The dinner was served by Jeanette Sprunger, Frances Burkhalter and Verna Alice Miller. The dinner table was centered with a large wedding cake topped with a miniature bride and groom.

A musical program was presented preceding the wedding ceremony. A piano prelude, "To a Wild Rose" by Macdowell was played by Miss Dorothy Sprunger and Mrs. Lester Eichenauer of Celina, O., sang "I Love You Truly", and "O, Promise Me". Mrs. Eichenauer and Rolland Sprunger sang a duet, "Where Thou Goest". As a recessional Miss Sprunger played Mendelssohn's Wedding March.

Rev. and Mrs. Cobble are graduates of the Moody Bible Institute in Chicago. Mrs. Cobble was a teacher in the Adams county schools. They will be at home after October 4 at Andersonville where Rev. Cobble is pastor of the Baptist church.
