CHARLES DUGAN DIES OF HEART ATTACK AT HOME THIS MORNING President of First State Bank; Recognized as Banking Leader In This Section FUNERAL TUESDAY

Charles A. Dugan, 73, president of the First State Bank, leading citizen and a former city school superintendent, prominent in midwest banking circles and one of the most successful bank executives in Indiana, died at his home, 420 W. Monroe street at 7:30 this morning of a heart attack.

Mr. Dugan had been in poor health for a few years. He suffered from asthma and the state of his health depended largely on climatic conditions. Regardless of his affliction and suffering, his interest in the business life of the community and his undying love for his work, carried him to his desk early every day. Last Wednesday his condition became worse and about noon he retired to his home. It was his last day at the bank.

At his bedside when death occurred, were members of the family and a local physician.

YOUNG LAD IS ELECTROCUTED

Simon Jauregui Dies at County Hospital Tuesday

An electric shock and a probably skull fracture caused the death of Simon Jauregui, 12 year old Mexican boy residing near the Schnepp school northeast of Decatur, at 1:30 o'clock Tuesday afternoon. The lad died at the Adams county memorial hospital where he was taken after he had come in contact with an electric wire at his home.

The boy suffered the shock at 10:30 o'clock Tuesday morning while he was engaged in making himself a swing. He had climbed a tree to construct the rope swing. He came in contact with an electric wire which was among the branches and fell 15 feet to the ground. He was immediately taken to the office of a Decatur physician and then removed to the hospital.

Simon was born in Craigville February 17, 1923, a son of Mr. and Mrs. Simon Jauregui, Sr. His mother preceded him in death. He was a member of the St. Mary's Catholic church in Decatur, and attended the public school.

Surviving beside the father are two brothers and a sister, Russel, Mike and Mary, all at home. Funeral services were held this morning at 9 o'clock at the St. Mary's Catholic church with Father J. J. Seimetz officiating. Burial was in the (cut off)
