A grade crossing on the Wabash Railway at Grabill was the scene of a horrible train-auto collision Friday afternoon which claimed the lives of the entire Marion McBride family of 12. One daughter, Phyllis, aged 5, was carried in part of the twisted wreckage of the (?) 1,100 feet on the pilot of the locomotive to the spot marked "X" in the photograph. Witnesses stated that apparently the engine (cut off) McBride automobile was cold, since the car had proceeded only about 200 feet from a filling station where it had been halted for at least (cut off) minutes, and stalled as a result of the pull up the grade.

Two Injured Children Fail to Survive Accident; Versions of Witnesses and Trainmen Are Conflicting

MASS PUBLIC FUNERAL TO BE HELD TUESDAY

Coroner Pushes Plans for Investigation of Worst Crossing Tragedy in Recent Indiana History

The death of Phyllis McBride, aged 5, in St. Joseph's Hospital at 9:05 a.m. today brought the toll of the Grabill crossing tragedy to 12 persons, the entire Marion McBride family, as Coroner Walter E. Kruse made plans for a formal inquest Tuesday night.

The final victim of Friday's train-auto crash died after a desparate all-night struggle on the part of attending physicians to save her life. Her sister, Clara, aged 14, died at 10:45 last night.

In addition to the father, mother and nine children who met death in the crash, an infant died at birth which occurred when the mother was hurled from the heavily loaded family car as it was struck by a Wabash passenger train.

A mass funeral service will be held here Tuesday afternoon for the dead: Marion McBride, aged 43, Grabill farmer and WPA worker; his wife, Susan, aged 41, and their children: Marion Jr., aged 12; Mary Agnes, aged 10; Arthur, aged 8; Virginia, aged 6; Robert, aged 3; Richard and Ramona, aged 17 months; Clara, Phyllis and the infant.
