LOCAL WOMAN FINDS HER LONG LOST RELATIVES

Mrs. Jennie Moser Learns Marion McBride, Crash Victim Was Her Half-Brother WERE SEPARATED MANY YEARS AGO

As a remarkable result of the grade accident at Grabill, Indiana, last January, a local woman has found her lost relatives.

Mrs. Jennie Moser, of Berne, received news today which verified a belief that Marion McBride, victim of the crash, along with his family was her half-brother.

Mrs. Moser was separated from her family when very young being taken to raise by Peter M. Moser, deceased, and seeing very little of the McBride family since then. Once, on one of the times she saw them, Marion, the accident victim, was a babe in arms.

Newspaper reports, which listed the survivors, gave names that were remembered by Mrs. Moser as those of her family and so Mrs. Moser felt sure enough of it to send an inquiry to her long-lost relatives, and today the answer came which confirmed it.

Throughout the years, no trace could be found of her relatives, until it was too late to see some of them. Unfortunately, only the loss of one of them could bring news of the others.

Grover and Clinton McBride, and Mrs. Dorothy Jensen, all of Fort Wayne, are half-brothers and half-sister of Mrs. Moser and Mrs. Mary McBride, of Convoy, Ohio, is her step-mother.

Mrs. Moser, well known here, has eight living children and one child, LaVerne, is deceased. Those living are Edwin T. Moser of Geneva, Dennis Moser of Bluffton, Willis D. Moser of Woodburn, Mrs. Homer C. Amstutz, Mrs. Harry T. Eckrote, Amos, Tillman, and Ivan, of Berne.
