Lester Pontius, aged 24, of Geneva, an employe of the Nussbaum Novelty Co. here, suffered a double fracture of his pelvis bone in the accident at Toledo, O., last Friday, it has been learned here. Pontius has been placed in a cast and will have to remain in the cast for about six weeks, it is said. He is confined to a Toledo hospital but may possibly be brought to his home at Geneva by Saturday or Sunday. He is reported to be suffering considerable pain.

Pontius was in the car driven by Edison Lehman of this place. Other occupants of the car were Elmer Inniger, Valentine Egly, Harold Bailey, and Hubert Wheeler. They were on their way to Swanton, O., to go through a cedar chest factory.
