The couple were attended by Miss Julia Colpaert, sister of the bride, and Clarence Lengerich, brother of the groom.

Miss Colpaert chose as her wedding gown a white satin dress with a veil, train and long sleeves. Her accessories were white. She carried a bouquet of white roses. Her bridesmaid, Miss Julia Colpaert wore a floor-length gown of maize fashioned with a cape and white accessories. She carried yellow roses.

The groom appeared in a suit of oxford gray. His attendant, Clarence Lengerich, wore dark blue. Herbert Heff and Herman Wolpert were ushers.
