Mrs. Von Gunten died at 4:10 o'clock Tuesday morning from complications following the birth of a baby daughter, Constance Kay. The infant, born prematurely, is kept in an incubator at the hospital and is reported making some progress. Mrs. Von Gunten never rallied from the Caesarean operation performed at 12:30 Monday morning.

Mrs. Von Gunten was very popular here and at Decatur and the news of her untimely death came as a great shock. She was the third young woman to die in this community in the past two weeks.
