Light, became the bride of Morton Teeple of Pleasant Mills, in an informal church ceremony which took place at seven o'clock Sunday morning at the United Brethren church. Rev. G. T. Rosselot officiated at the double ring service, which was witnessed by Mr. and Mrs. Jesse Essex of this city.

Miss Irene Light, sister of the bride, presented a short program of organ music during the ceremony, playing "Because" by Edward Teschemacher and "I Love You Truly" by Carrie Jacobs-Bond.

The bride's youthful ensemble was a redingote of soldier blue traveling sheer, with hat and footwear to match. Her corsage was of roses and snapdragons.

Mr. and Mrs. Teeple left immediately following the ceremony for a wedding trip to Erie, Pennsylvania. After August 12, they will be at home in their newly furnished apartment on Mercer avenue.
