Miss Faye Virginia Myers, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Myers of Blue Creek township, became the bride of LaDoyt Miller, son of Mr. and Mrs. Roy Miller, also of Blue Creek township, in a ceremony performed Sunday evening in the parsonage of the Methodist church at (cut off)

...Rev. Robert Johnson received the single ring vows. Mrs. Marcile Williamson of this city, sister of the bride, was the bridesmaid and Maurice Miller was the best man.

Both the bride and her attendant wore street length dresses of soldier blue with matching hats. The bride wore a shoulder corsage of red roses and white baby mums and carried a linen handkerchief belonging to her mother. Her attendant wore a corsage of glads.

Following the wedding, a reception was held at the home of the bride's parents with immediate friends and relatives present, including employees of the Newberry store where the bride is employed.

Among the guests were Mr. and Mrs. Ed Foreman and Mr. and Mrs. Ed Miller, grandparents of the couple.

The bride is a graduate of Pleasant Mills high school class of 1937 and has since been employed at the local store. The groom was also graduated from the Pleasant Mills high school with the class of 1935. He is employed at the Schafer store in this city (cut off)

BERNE NEWS

Preparations have nearly been completed for the conscription registration here next Wednesday, October 16. Registration places in Berne will be at the town hall and Main Street filling station. It is expected that several hundred men from Berne and community who are between the ages of 21 and 45 will register.

The Monroe township and Hartford township Sunday School conventions will be held next Sunday. The Monroe township convention will hold the afternoon session at

the Winchester U. B. church, with Rev. C. P. Maas, pastor the Berne Evangelical church as the speaker. The evening session will be held at the Monroe Methodist church, with Kenneth Shoemaker of Geneva as the speaker. The Hartford convention will be held Sunday evening at the Linn Grove Christian church. Rev. E. Johnson will speak.

The First Bank of Berne will be closed all day next Saturday, October 12, in observance of Discovery Day. Otherwise local business places will operate as usual.

Gyneth Schindler, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Vilas Schindler, has been elected president of the Alpha music and literary society of the Berne high school. Miss Marie Schwartz, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. D. R. Schwartz was named president of the Arena society. Edward Eichenberger was named editor in chief of "Our Yesterdays", Berne high school publication.

Among those from here who attended the funeral of James Sprunger, 22, of Decatur, Illinois, were Mr. and Mrs. Franklin Sprunger, Mr. and Mrs. Victor Sprunger, Mrs. C. C. Sprunger, W. R. Sprunger, and daughter Patricia. The young man shot and killed himself at the home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Asa Sprunger of Decatur.

Rev. D. C. and Mrs. Anna Stucky of Detroit attended the funeral of Peter Liechty, which was held at the Mennonite church on Tuesday. Rev. Stucky is superintendent of the Detroit City Rescue Mission.

Mary Mazelin, daughter of Mrs. Florence Mazelin of Berne, suffered a gash in her head and other injuries when she fell off her bicycle.

BARBERS WITHOUT LICENSE, FINED

Ellison Neuenschwander, of Berne, was fined \$25 and costs in city court by Mayor Forrest Elzey Saturday on a charge of barbering without a license. The fine and costs amounted to \$40.

Mayor Elzey imposed the fine when Neuenschwander changed a previously not guilty plea for one of guilty. He had been arraigned the week before on the county and pleaded not guilty, posting a \$40 bond. His trial had been set for Tuesday.
