INVENTION IS PATENTED HERE

Adam Kunowich Patents Invention of "Automatic Igniter"

An invention, which he asserts will revolutionize the entire stove industry of the nation, has been completed and patented here by Adam Kunowich, of Winchester street, veteran G.E. worker and Decatur resident.

An "automatic igniter" is the patented invention of Mr. Kunowich - a device which automatically puts in operation a range, gas or any type of coal stove.

A model of the igniter, now in operation at the Kunowich home on Winchester street, is evidence of its usefulness, he states. At night before the Kunowichs retire, the percolator and breakfast foods are set on the stove and in the morning when they arise on schedule the breakfast is ready.

The automatic clock, which can be set at intervals from five seconds to six hours, automatically starts the heat under the desired food, he states. Most important, Mr. Kunowich states, is the fact that it will bring the older type stoves into competition with the newer and more modern (cut off)
