Naming of the 3,299th and 3,300th babies - twins - delivered by Dr. Amos Reusser, well known "horse and buggy doctor" threatened to hold up this story today. But they're here.

The twins, a boy No. 3299 and a girl No. 3,300 were born to William and Berniece Kuhn Brunner this forenoon at the Brunner (cut off)

...Mr. Muselman is a brother of C. H. Muselman here and the father was instrumental in making it possible for the German family to come here. A sister of Mrs. Muselman, who accompanied them to the states, was married to Elroy Winteregg since she came to this country and resides at Decatur.

Gerhardt, a son, who came here to escape military training under Fuehrer Hitler, is a Sophomore at B.H.S. His sister, Heidi, is a member of the sixth grade. Gerhardt will be in conscription age when he returns to Germany.
