Funeral Tuesday For Mrs. Elizabeth Catherine Grandlienard, 85

Mrs. Elizabeth Catherine Grandlienard, aged 85, widow of the late Henry Grandlienard, died at nine o'clock Saturday evening at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Rueben Miller, in Nottingham twp., Wells county, west of Linn Grove. She lived just three-fourths of a mile from Mrs. Susan Gottschalk who died Sunday morning, and both were members of the Old Salem church.

Mrs. Grandlienard had lived with her daughter for the past 19 years. She had been in failing health for three years and was bedfast the last six weeks. She was widely and prominently known.

Mrs. Grandlienard was born in Ohio, Feb. 11, 1854, a daughter of Samuel and Sarah Jane Bricker Winkler. She was married to Henry Grandlienard on Nov. 5, 1877, near Linn Grove. He preceded. Mrs. Grandlienard lived west of Linn Grove for more than ? years.

Surviving are the daughter, Mrs. Miller; one son, Charles Grandlienard, of west of Berne and a sister, Mrs. Barbara Alberson, of Geneva. Eight grandchildren and one great-grandchild survive.

A daughter and a son preceded, Mrs. Harve Garboden and Fred Grandlienard. Three sisters and one brother preceded.

Mrs. Grandlienard was a member of the Old Salem church for 50 years. The body was removed Sunday evening from the L. L. Yager and Sons funeral parlors here to the Miller home. The funeral will be held Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Old Salem church, Rev. George Holston officiating. Burial will be in the church cemetery.
