PAUL G. RILEY DIES

LAFAYETTE, Ind., Dec. 26 - Paul G. Riley, 46, prominent in the Middle West as a poultry breeder, died last night on his farm near West Lafayette. Riley was formerly connected with the Purdue University Agricultural Department.

He graduated from Purdue in 1927, became an officer in the Army Aviation Corp., and served overseas during the World War.

He is survived by his widow, three children and his parents, the Rev. and Mrs. H. C. Riley. His father is a pioneer Methodist minister in Indiana.
